Kitten Update



Rita, Roddy and Tabitha, the lovely kitten Trio have been in to the practice for the next critical step in their care, neutering and microchipping.

Neutering is recommended for many reasons, stop unwanted pregnancy and control the cat population, reduce undesirable behaviors like urine marking, roaming, fighting, calling, and escaping. Neutering also reduces health risks like some cancers and reproductive infections.

Cats can be neutered from any age, ideally before you start letting your kitten outside. We normally recommend neutering at around 4 months of age, as soon as the kitten vaccine schedule is complete.


Adder Bites

As the weather warms up, keep an eye out for adders when walking your dog - especially in woodland or heath areas. Adder bites are rare but can be serious, so if you spot swelling or sudden lameness after a walk, don't wait. We accept emergencies 24/7, please call **01934 852 422**.



Tick Bites

Spending more time in long grass or wooded areas increases the risk of ticks for both dogs and cats. These tiny pests can carry harmful diseases, so regular checks are essential. Langford Club members get 12 months of parasite protection find out more and join today.



Fig's Story: Adder Bite

Meet Fig, who was out enjoying a sunny walk, when she suddenly returned limping, holding up her paw. Her owner had spotted signs warning, "Take care – Adders are emerging," and knew something wasn't right.

We saw Fig the same day and found two small puncture wounds on her swollen foot - likely from an adder bite. After a gentle sedation, our team cleaned the wounds and checked for any foreign objects. Luckily, none were found, and Fig was treated promptly for the bite.

Thanks to quick action and care, Fig has made a full recovery and is back enjoying her walks (while steering clear of long grass!).
